The TRRA supports the action being taken by the Nelson Bay Chamber of Business to clean up the graffiti, however believes that the culture behind the vandalism needs to be understood and addressed in a way that solves the problem in the long term, and that our Council should take some responsibility to remedy the situation.

This is not just a Tomaree problem, it is evident throughout the municipality, and we need both the Council and the Community to become involved, if we are to successfully tackle this problem.
